



**NEW GILLIBRAND REPORT: OVER 330,000 MORE NEW YORKERS UNEMPLOYED SINCE BUSH-ERA TAX CUTS ESTABLISHED**

According to data from the New York State Department of Labor, more than 330,000 more New Yorkers have become unemployed since the Bush tax cuts were established in 2001. Ending the Bush tax cuts for the wealthiest Americans would save U.S. taxpayers approximately \$22 billion each year.
