Federal Funding Requests

Senator Kirsten Gillibrand

City of Buffalo – Emergency Vehicle Tracking System; \$800,000; Buffalo City Hall, 65 Niagara Square, Buffalo, NY 14202

The City plans to install GPS tracking devices in all 545 City of Buffalo vehicles to enable greater coordination and improve response times in the event of an emergency.

Essex County – Public Safety Radio System; \$5,000,000; 7551 Court Street, Elizabethtown, NY 12932

This initiative will provide a public safety radio system for the county, which is currently lacking a comprehensive working emergency communications system. This project is estimated to create 30 jobs.

Hughsonville Fire District – Firehouse Expansion, Renovation and Upgrade; \$7,000,000; 88 Old Hopewell Road, P.O. Box 545, Hughsonville, NY 12537

This initiative is for expanding, renovating and completing the upgrade of the Hughsonville Fire District's firehouse that currently poses serious hazards to the safety and well-being of the fire department's members. This project will create an estimated 75 jobs.

Jewish Board of Family and Children's Services – Community Disaster Preparedness; \$250,000;

This project builds on the Jewish Board's extensive experience treating trauma and our connections to community based care programs throughout New York City to create, disseminate and train practitioners in the use of a tool kit for treating vulnerable populations following incidents of terrorism or natural disaster. This project is expected to create four jobs.

National Center for Security and Preparedness at the University at Albany, SUNY – Critical Infrastructure Protection Analyst Training; \$5,000,000; 423 State Street, Albany, NY 12065

This initiative will provide support for the National Center for Security and Preparedness' administrative and technical efforts related to the development and delivery of a Department of Homeland Security certified course that will train critical infrastructure protection analysts. This project is estimated to create 6 jobs.

North Country Community College – Emergency Preparedness in Essex and Franklin Counties; \$98,400; P.O. Box 89, 23 Santanoni Avenue, Saranac Lake, NY 12983

Serving Essex and Franklin Counties from campuses in Malone, Saranac Lake, and Ticonderoga, North Country Community College will provide Adirondack residents reliable emergency shelter and food service and increase public safety with the addition of regional emergency communications technology. This project is estimated to create 18 jobs.

Town of Clarkstown – Clarkstown Police Department Off-Site Disaster Center; \$500,000; 10 Maple Avenue, New City, NY 10956

This project will develop a redundant public safety communications system for the region by constructing a backup off-site emergency communications facility.

Town of North Hempstead – Emergency Operations Center; \$750,000; 220 Plandome Road, Manhasset, NY 11030

The project will create a new, innovative high-technology emergency management center with equipment to serve the entire town-wide population. It will be a facility that directly serves the public, and is operated using public funds. An estimated 10 jobs will be created by this project.

Village of Kiryas Joel – Regional Emergency Operations Center; \$1,000,000; Municipal Building, 51 Forest Road, Monroe, NY 10950

This initiative will involve the development of an Emergency Operations Center, which will serve the entire region in the event of natural or man-made disaster. This project is estimated to create 15 jobs.

Warren County Office of Emergency Services – Warren-Washington County Regional Emergency Services Training and Education Center; \$760,000; 1340 State Route 9, Lake George, NY 12845

This initiative will include the construction of a bi-county, regional, multi-jurisdictional education and training facility for all emergency responders, including fire, law enforcement and emergency personnel. This project will create an estimated 60 jobs.

Westchester County – Emergency Service Unit; \$300,000; 148 Martine Avenue, White Plains, NY 10601

This project includes the upgrading of infrastructure and equipment for Westchester County's Emergency Service Unit, which is a specially trained unit for responding to natural and man-made disasters. This project will create 12 jobs.

Yeshiva University – Security Initiatives; \$1,500,000; 500 West 185th Street, New York, NY 10033

This project is to install new security infrastructure, such as photo-ID, biometrics and smart cards to allow for greater security of the university, which has been on the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's watch-list due to the nature of potential terrorist activity. This project is estimated to create 50 jobs.
