



**NEW GILLIBRAND REPORT: OVER 123,000 MANUFACTURING JOBS
 LOST FROM 2005 TO 2010**

*Advanced Manufacturing Jobs On The Rise: Computer & Electronic Manufacturing Jobs Up
 9 Percent From 2004 to 2008*

While New York State lost a total of more than 123,000 manufacturing jobs from 2005 to 2010, high-tech and advanced manufacturing are sectors within the manufacturing industry that are growing, according to a 2010 report on manufacturing in New York from the Office of the State Comptroller, and have major potential to create more new jobs.

- Computer and electronic manufacturing industries increased employment by 9 percent from 2004 to 2008.
- Of the 250,000 computer and electronic manufacturing jobs in upstate New York, 44 percent are in the most advanced technology areas.
- Jobs in information and communications technology are also on the rise – with 6,000 new jobs in this field created from 2004 to 2008, and another 1,800 new jobs in life science technologies. Both of these industries have average salaries of \$70,000 and higher.
