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**A BILL**

To protect firefighters from exposure to per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “PFAS Firefighter Pro-  
5 tection Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON FIREFIGHTING FOAM CON-**  
7 **TAINING PFAS.**

8 (a) PROHIBITION.—Beginning on the date that is 2  
9 years after the date of enactment of this Act, no person  
10 may manufacture, import, process, or distribute in com-  
11 merce any aqueous film forming foam for use in training

1 and firefighting that contains a per- or polyfluoroalkyl  
2 substance.

3 (b) VIOLATIONS.—A violation of subsection (a) shall  
4 be considered to be a violation of section 15(1) of the  
5 Toxic Substances Control Act (15 U.S.C. 2614(1)).

6 **SEC. 3. DEADLINE TO PROHIBIT AQUEOUS FILM FORMING**  
7 **FOAM (AFFF) USE AT AIRPORTS.**

8 Section 332 of the FAA Reauthorization Act of 2018  
9 (49 U.S.C. 44706 note) is amended by adding at the end  
10 the following:

11 “(c) PROHIBITION.—Not later than October 5, 2024,  
12 the Administrator, using the latest version of the standard  
13 containing the minimum requirements for aircraft rescue  
14 and fire-fighting (ARFF) services at airports, shall pro-  
15 hibit the use of fluorinated chemicals in firefighting foam  
16 at airports.”.
