

 - Peer Support Disaster Response





Launched 2021

- 2,000 individuals trained to date

- Awarded grant for Train-the-Trainer program, delivery expected 2026



- Opened March 2017
- 64 bed facility; average 35 day length of stay
- 3,913 members treated as of 7/16/24
- Exclusively for current/retired IAFF members
- Dually licensed to treat mental health & addiction
- Daily boarding fees paid by IAFF
- In-network with most major insurance plans
- 18-month of aftercare monitoring and outreach
- Monthly visits from IAFF behavioral health staff
