## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Safe to Report Act".

## 5 SEC. 2. SAFE TO REPORT POLICY APPLICABLE ACROSS THE 6 ARMED FORCES.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Defense shall,
8 in consultation with the Secretaries of the military depart9 ments and the Secretary of Homeland Security, prescribe

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in regulations a safe to report policy described in sub section (b) that applies with respect to all members of the
 Armed Forces (including members of the reserve compo nents of the Armed Forces) and cadets and midshipmen
 at the military service academies.

6 (b) SAFE TO REPORT POLICY.—The safe to report 7 policy described in this subsection is a policy under which 8 a member of the Armed Forces who is the alleged victim 9 of sexual assault, but who may have committed minor col-10 lateral misconduct at or about the time of such sexual assault, or whose minor collateral misconduct is discovered 11 12 only as a result of the investigation into such sexual as-13 sault, may report such sexual assault to proper authorities without fear or receipt of discipline in connection with 14 15 such minor collateral misconduct absent aggravating circumstances that increase the gravity of the minor collat-16 17 eral misconduct or its impact on good order and discipline. 18 (c) MINOR COLLATERAL MISCONDUCT.—For pur-19 poses of the safe to report policy, minor collateral mis-

20 conduct shall include any of the following:

21 (1) Improper use or possession of alcohol.

22 (2) Consensual intimate behavior (including23 adultery) or fraternization.

24 (3) Presence in an off-limits area.

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(4) Such other misconduct as the Secretary of
 Defense shall specify in the regulations under sub section (a).

4 (d) AGGRAVATING CIRCUMSTANCES.—The regula5 tions under subsection (a) shall specify aggravating cir6 cumstances that increase the gravity of minor collateral
7 misconduct or its impact on good order and discipline for
8 purposes of the safe to report policy.
